City's Tree Planting Program Extended

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(April 27, 2010) The city of Waxahachie has extended the sales period for its annual tree planning program. The trees will now be sold into the summer, as supplies last.

The public is able to purchase a tree in honor or memory of loved ones. Businesses are also able to purchase trees on a sponsorship basis. The city will hold a ceremonial tree planting in October to recognize the purchases and those that made donations will receive a commemorative program as a keepsake.

“Waxahachie is known for our beautiful crape myrtles, as well as other trees, and we want to make sure that we are proactive in maintaining our tree population,” said John Smith, director of the city’s parks and recreation department.

A total of up to 25 trees will be planted, five each of five varieties. This year the trees to choose from are crape myrtle, live oak, red oak, Mexican plum and cedar elm. The cost is \$200 each and all trees are a 2-3 inch caliper size. “We are limiting the number to 25, so that we can make sure they trees are properly maintained over the first year. They will require watering and care, and we want to make sure we have the manpower to care for them,” said Smith.
